The Constitution Park Summer Day Camp program is sponsored by the City of Cumberland Parks and Recreation Department. The camp is open to children ages 6, (having completed first grade) to 12 years old. The Camp includes outdoor activities, organized games, arts and crafts, tennis, swimming lessons, and educational experiences. Breakfast and Lunch is provided daily, made possible by the Summer Food Service Program for Children, Sponsored by the US Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service. Parents are responsible for providing transportation for participants for this program. Regular hours of operation are Monday-Friday, 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Extended hours are offered for an additional fee of \$10/week per child for Day Camp. If you choose to use the extended hours program, please be aware that no supervision will be provided before 8 a.m. or after 5 p.m. If your child arrives before 9 a.m. or leaves after 4 p.m. regularly, you will be charged for the extended hour program. If your child must arrive late or leave early, please notify the camp director.

**2021 PARKS AND RECREATION DAY CAMP COVID 19
REGULATIONS MANDATED
BY MD. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH and CDC**

PLEASE READ, SIGN and RETURN BOTTOM PORTION

NO 5 years will be allowed to participate in Camp this year.

Camp will be for Children 6 to 12 years old. (All 6-year-old participants must have completed the First Grade!)

No Exceptions!

1. This year will be a TOTALLY OUTDOOR camp this summer, as we are NOT permitted to use the buildings.
2. Camp will be on a FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE basis this year. PAYMENT MUST be made at the time of registration. and weekly for those planning to attend for the 7 weeks. THURSDAYS will be our renewal/ registration day. PLEASE make sure your campers fees are paid on time. IF NOT, you may run the risk of losing their spot.
3. DROP OFF/PICKUP— PARENTS and CAMPERS 9 are REQUIRED to wear a mask/ face covering. All Counselors/staff are also required to wear one also.
4. DROP OFF/ PICKUP will be at the PAVILION 1 & 2, upon arrival your child's temperature will be taken and recorded daily per MDH mandates. PLEASE wait in your car if someone is ahead of you. All COUNSELORS will also be monitored and recorded daily as well. Campers will then have to wash/sanitize hands after temperature is taken. IF your camper(s)temperature is higher than 100.4, they will NOT be PERMITTED to attend camp PER MDH.
5. Due to the Pandemic, our camp size will be limited this summer. OUR GROUPS will consist of 9 CAMPERS and 1 COUNSELOR. Social distancing will be enforced. NO GROUPS MAY JOIN TOGETHER!!! Campers will remain with the same counselor the entire time.

6. We will encourage campers to wear bathing suits under their clothing this summer, as we CANNOT use POOL CHANGING ROOMS, except to use bathroom facilities. Campers may not swim everyday (not sure yet) due to the number of patrons allowed in the pool at one time. We will TRY our best to take each group for at least an hour everyday if possible. We'll keep you updated. LIFE JACKETS will NOT be available at the pool. If your child needs a life jacket you will have to provide it.
7. ALL activities will be done in individual groups.
8. PLEASE send water/drinks with your camper(s). Put their names on them. We are trying to keep them from using the water fountains.
9. INCLEMENT WEATHER/ CODE RED DAYS - we will monitor the upcoming weather daily and try our best to keep you informed about camp ahead of time. We realize that severe thunderstorms pop up in the summer, if this happens, we will move the campers to a safe area. With CODE RED DAYS, which are excessive heat and humidity, we will do the same.
10. INFECTION CONTROL STRATEGIES WILL BE ENFORCED:
 - a. MASKS/FACE COVERINGS
 - b. TEMPERATURE OVER 100.4 camper(s) MAY NOT ATTEND CAMP.
 - c. COUGH/SNEEZE into elbow
 - d. AVOID use of items (toys/games) NOT EASILY DISINFECTED. i.e.: LEGOS, BLOCKS, JENGA, BOARD GAMES ETC.
 - e. HAND SANITIZING/WASHING on a regular basis. (Campers and equipment)
 - f. ANYONE exhibiting symptoms will be isolated and parents will be called. (Counselors exhibiting will have to leave camp.) Testing will have to be done.
 - g. ANY POSITIVE(S) campers /counselors, ENTIRE camp will have to be QUARANTINED for 14 days, and MAY have to CLOSE based on consultation with MDH.
 - h. BATHROOMS WILL BE SANITIZED on a regular basis as well. A

- Log will be kept with date, time and the individual who cleaned.
11. IF YOUR CHILD(REN) HAVE UNDERLYING MEDICAL CONDITIONS, or RESPIRATORY PROBLEMS such as ASTHMA, YOU WILL NEED a RELEASE FROM PEDIATRICIAN/ PRIMARY CARE to attend camp.
 12. WE are included in the SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM being run by the school system. If your camper(s) choose to pack, we are allowed to use the refrigerator. ONLY camp counselors may put it in and take it out for lunch. EACH group's counselor will hand out lunches to the non-packers.
 13. NO FIELD TRIPS THIS SUMMER
 14. OUR goal is to provide each camper with a sanitized bag from the pool bag room to keep their belongings in. EACH bag will have the campers name on it and be kept in a specific spot.
 15. ANYONE NOT COMPLYING WITH COVID 19 guidelines AND CAMP RULES WILL BE ASKED TO NOT RETURN.

Constitution Park Summer Day Camp – 2021
(See also Special Rules – COVID 19 Regulations)

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Cumberland Parks and Recreation Department has planned a seven-week Day Camp Program for your child this summer. Regular hours of operation are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Before and after care hours extend the day to 8 a.m. to 5 a.m. Registration is made on a weekly basis with a fee paid prior to each week attending. An extra fee is charged for the before and after care hours.

This program is offered through the services of the Cumberland Parks and Recreation Department, U.S. Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Service & MD State Department of Education and Allegany County Department of Social Services.

Included in the daily program is Breakfast and Lunch provided by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, summer meal program. Daily activities include outdoor play, swimming, organized learning activities, arts & crafts, dance, reading, and special events.

Mrs. Carol Brown is the Camp Director and Mrs. Debi Mullan is the Camp Assistant Director. They share between them over 30 years of experience with the Constitution Park Day Camp. They are both experienced educators with many years of teaching experience. They are available daily at the park camp.

There will be a few rules and recommendations that each child must follow in order to be able to continue attending Day Camp:

1. Throughout the Day Camp weeks, many activities and events are planned, and each child will be expected to cooperate and participate with a proper attitude, listen to and follow all directions given by camp staff.
2. If at any time a child's behavior becomes uncontrollable or uncooperative, a phone call will be made to the parents. If the child misbehaves again, the child will be sent home and may not be permitted to return.
3. No child is to leave Day Camp with a parent or friend unless the Camp Director or staff members are notified by note and contacted in person to confirm the child's departure.
4. Every child must cooperate at all times with fellow camp participants. The staff will have full responsibility for your child each day, so it is important that everyone works together for a pleasant experience throughout the summer.
5. Campers are responsible for maintaining a respectful environment. Bullying and sexual harassment **WILL NOT** be tolerated. Sexual harassment may include but is not limited to: leering at someone else's body; making comments, gestures, or jokes of a sexual nature; or teasing in sexual terms. The Camp Director reserves the right to dismiss any child who cannot behave appropriately.

6. Campers should not leave their group at anytime. Campers should be with a leader at all times. The Recreation Department staff is responsible for the safety and welfare of each camper. Anyone breaking this rule will be immediately dismissed from the camp program.
7. Each child should bring a swimsuit and towel daily. Please make sure that all items are properly marked and are in an identifiable bag. Follow pool and day camp rules when swimming. No one should go to the snack bar without first getting permission from a leader. No one should go to the snack bar alone.
8. No valuables are to be brought to Day Camp including personal toys, cell phones or other electronics. Camp personnel **will not** be responsible for any lost or stolen items. We also discourage children from bringing money to Camp. (Breakfast and Lunch are served daily.)
9. Knives and other objects that could be viewed as weapons are not permitted at camp.
10. Children should help keep the Park and Day Camp area clean. Each camper should clean up their own work area.
11. Campers should respect others and their property. Persons taking things which do not belong to them will not be tolerated.
12. The program will operate rain or shine; please have the children dress for the weather.
13. Campers should wear shoes and socks every day; flip-flops and/or sandals are not appropriate for the variety of activities that your child will be participating in.
14. Any medication should be placed in possession of Camp Director or Assistant Camp Director.
15. Due to COVID 19 regulations there will be no Bus Transportation provided this year.
- 16. New for Summer 2021 Day Camp will be limited to children ages 6 to 12, with all 6-year old's having completed the First Grade.**

Please read through these rules with your child (ren) so we all may have an enjoyable summer. Through a positive and cooperative attitude by all participants and staff, we are sure your child will most certainly enjoy their Day Camp experiences.
